



City of Park Ridge Tree Preservation Agreement For Patios, Decks, Driveways, Swimming Pools and Sheds

The City of Park Ridge Municipal Code entitled *Tree Preservation (Article 15, Chapter 22)* requires trees to be preserved and protected on private property during construction or any other improvement where trees may be damaged during construction.

A PRESERVATION PLAN MUST BE SUBMITTED TO THE CITY FORESTER IF ANY TREES CONFLICT WITH THE PROPOSED CONSTRUCTION OR IMPROVEMENT PRIOR TO THE ISSUANCE OF A BUILDING PERMIT. The area of focus is any area under the dripline (area under branches) of any trees in the construction zone. This includes the actual construction area as well as access to the construction site and storage areas for equipment and materials.

Check the following box as it applies to your site plan:

- There are NO trees on the subject property.
- There are tree(s) on the property, however, construction activity will not occur under the entire dripline (area under branches) of the tree(s).
- There are tree(s) within the construction zone. I have talked to the City Forester about the protection of these trees.

The undersigned affirms that he/she is the person having primary responsibility for the construction or improvement work related to the issuance of building permit number _____, and that no work will be performed in violation of the Tree Preservation Ordinance of the City of Park Ridge according to the guidelines listed above. Please contact the Forestry Department (318-5451) for specific requirements needed on plans involving the Tree Preservation Ordinance.

Violation of the Tree Preservation Ordinance may result in fines up to \$500 for each violation. Each day that a violation exists shall constitute a separate offense.
