**2. Review Case #13-09159**

Mr. Fulvior stated that his dog, Brook, was tied up to the tree on a leash while his family was planting flowers in the yard. His daughter had tied the leash to the tree, but unfortunately the dog got loose. According to Mr. Fulvior, his dog then went to sniff the victim, but then the victim kicked the dog and that's when the dog bit.

Commissioner Morrisroe asked the age of the dog and if there were any issues between the dog and his daughters friends. Mr. Fulvior stated that his dog was five years old and that there were never any issues between the dog and his daughters friends.

Chairwoman Gobbo asked if any incidents have happened before with their dog. Mr. Fulvior stated that there have not been any incidents.

Commissioner Morrisroe asked if there were issues between Mr. Fulvior and his neighbor (the victim). Mr. Fulvior stated that there are issues and that he would be addressing them.

The Commissioners unanimously agreed that the dog was not at-risk or dangerous and agreed to dismiss the case.
