RESOLUTION NO. 2013 -

**A RESOLUTION APPROVING AN AGREEMENT FOR
ACCESS TO GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SYSTEMS**

WHEREAS, the City of Park Ridge (the "City") is a home rule municipal corporation acting under and pursuant to the Illinois Constitution and the laws of the State of Illinois, including the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/1-1-1 *et seq.* (the "IMC"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to its home rule powers and the IMC, the City is granted all powers necessary to carry out its legislative purposes as to the general governance of the City and its residents, including the development and use of property, the establishment and maintenance of basic infrastructure such as streets, water systems, sanitary and stormwater sewer systems, and the provision of public safety services; and

WHEREAS, in the performance of its general governmental responsibilities, the City is constantly evaluating and accessing information regarding the physical and other attributes within the City and adjacent to its boundaries; and

WHEREAS, the Cook County Assessor's Office has a geographic information system ("GIS") database that it is willing to make available to the City at no cost; and

WHEREAS, GIS data sharing with the Cook County Assessor's Office will allow the City to access GIS data from the Assessor that will facilitate the City's decision-making process with respect to its management, provision, and maintenance of governmental services; and

WHEREAS, cooperation between and among governmental agencies and entities through intergovernmental agreements is authorized and encouraged by Article VII, Section 10 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970 and by the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1 *et seq.*; and

WHEREAS, the City and the Cook County Assessor have negotiated an Agreement for Access to Geographic Information System in substantially the form attached to this Resolution as Exhibit A (the "***Intergovernmental Agreement***");

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Park Ridge, County of Cook, State of Illinois, as follows:

Section 1: **Recitals.** The foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated into and made a part of this Resolution.

Section 2: **Approval of Intergovernmental Agreement.** The City Council hereby approves the Intergovernmental Agreement in substantially the form attached; provided that City Manager and Director of Public Works, in consultation with the City Attorney, are authorized to finalize the Intergovernmental Agreement. Once finalized, the Mayor or City Manager is authorized to execute the Intergovernmental Agreement on behalf of the City.

Section 3: **Effective Date.** This Resolution is effective upon its passage and approval in the manner provided by law.
