

The Department

Finance is responsible for preserving and enhancing the financial condition of the City, maintaining an effective accounting system and financial reporting, and collects all funds due to the City. The department is also responsible for preparing the operating budget, controlling records, accounting, purchasing and collection of all fees.

The Finance team has 11 full-time employees who administer the water billing program, customer service, purchasing, accounts payable, accounts receivable, payroll, and the financial operations software.

The Priorities


Provide excellent service delivery while containing costs. Continue process improvement measures to increase efficiencies, deliver excellent resident services, and continually provide services in the most cost-efficient manner.

Investment and Budgetary Strategy. With the Finance Director, continually monitor City funds to provide the best return on investment with minimum risk to principal. Create user friendly reports on the City's finances to provide transparency to the public and elected officials regarding the state of the City's finances.

Grant oversight. Consolidate oversight and management of all grants throughout the city. Utilize this information to provide guidance for departments and display work done by city employees to cut costs.

Maintain and enhance software. The City uses several platforms to provide services and maintain financial operations. Analyze these systems, their costs and benefits on a continual basis to determine potential enhancements to operations.





Compensation and Benefits

Starting salary range is from \$113,520 - \$125,335, depending on qualifications. The city also offers a GENEROUS BENEFITS PACKAGE, including:



Health Insurance. BlueCross BlueShield at a 13% premium cost to employees with options of HMO (\$0 deductible) and PPO (\$1,000 individual deductible).



Dental Insurance. Delta Dental at a 13% premium cost to employees with an annual maximum of \$1,500 per person.



Term Life Insurance. Valued at the Assistant Finance Director's annual salary (\$300,000 maximum).



Flexible Spending Accounts. Contribute pre-tax contributions to health or dependent accounts to use for qualifying expenses.



Pension. Membership in the Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund, an employee and employer funded pension fund.



Paid Time Off. Earn twenty (20) days per year accrued on a bi-weekly basis.



Admin Leave. Three (3) days credited at the beginning of each fiscal year and upon the date of hire.



Paid Holidays. Eight (8) paid City holidays each year.



Professional Development. Professional membership dues and ongoing professional development training.



Tuition Reimbursement. Up to \$2,500 annually.



Employee Assistance Program. Free and confidential short-term counseling services, resources and work/ life service specialists for employees and all household members.
