The National Infertility Association is hosting its Chicagoland **RESOLVE Walk of Hope** in Hodges Park. The event begins in Hodges Park at 8 am located at 101 S. Courtland Avenue (at Vine/Butler and Prospect). The event will bring together women, men and families who will be walking in support of the 7.3 million Americans struggling to build a family.

“The committed volunteers of Chicago and hundreds of walkers will walk together to symbolize the infertility journey. RESOLVE exists so no one with infertility ‘walks’ alone,” said RESOLVE President/CEO Barbara Collura. “So often people are unable to resolve their infertility because of barriers like finances, isolation, and laws denying access to care. RESOLVE wants to remove all barriers for people struggling to build a family, and our Walks of Hope help us fulfill our mission.” RESOLVE’s Walk of Hope not only helps raise awareness about the disease of infertility, it is also a fundraiser that helps RESOLVE build a strong community for people with infertility and works to break down barriers so many face while trying to build a family. Currently there are only nine free infertility support groups in the Chicagoland area. There are an estimated 448,356 women in Illinois who are impacted by infertility.
