# CITY OF PARK RIDGE MAYOR EXECUTIVE ORDER 2020-03

Issue Date: June 4, 2020

## Order Instituting Temporary Regulatory Relief For Restaurants Due to the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency (Short Term Parking)

#### I. Findings.

- A. COVID-19 (a.k.a., Novel Coronavirus) is a severe respiratory illness caused by the SARS-CoV-2 virus, a new strain of coronavirus that is spread from person to person, posing a threat to the health and safety of the residents of the City of Park Ridge.
  - B. No drug or vaccine is currently available to treat or prevent COVID-19.
- C. On January 27, 2020, United States Department of Health and Human Services Secretary Alex Azar declared a national public health emergency due to COVID-19.
- D. On March 9, 2020, Illinois Governor J.B. Pritzker issued a Gubernatorial Disaster Proclamation declaring that all counties in the State of Illinois, including Cook County, are disaster areas due to the Novel Coronavirus.
- E. On March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization ("WHO") declared COVID-19 to be a global pandemic.
- F. On March 13, 2020, President of the United States Donald Trump issued a declaration of a national emergency due to the growing COVID-19 crisis in the United States, and on March 26, 2020, President Trump issued a major disaster declaration for the State of Illinois due to the COVID-19 crisis.
- G. On March 20, 2020, Governor Pritzker issued an Executive Order requiring all non-essential persons to stay at home with limited exceptions and non-essential businesses to cease operations with limited exceptions, which order was effective March 21, 2020 through April 7, 2020, and has been extended to April 30, 2020 ("Stay at Home Order").
- H. On March 18, 2020, Mayor Marty Maloney issued a Declaration of a Local State of Emergency for the City of Park Ridge to address the impact of COVID-19 on the City of Park Ridge and its residents and business and property owners, which Declaration was approved and extended by the Park Ridge City Council by Resolution No. 2020-22, and further extended by the City Council from time to time ("*Emergency Declaration*").
- I. On May 5, 2020, Governor Pritzker released the Restore Illinois Plan, a 5 phase plan designed to adopt a public health approach to reopening the State's economy based on the medical data presented by the Illinois Department of Public Health.

- J. On May 20, 2020, Governor Pritzker announced a revision to Phase 3 of the Restore Illinois Plan to permit greater operating opportunities for restaurants, subject to adherence to public health regulations and safeguards recommended by the Illinois Department of Public Health.
- K. Governor Pritzker's announcement of the amendment to Phase 3 of the Restore Illinois Plan expressed municipalities are encouraged to help restaurants and bars expand their outdoor seating options.

#### II. Order.

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Office of Mayor by the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/11-1-6), the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act (20 ILCS 3305/11), Article 3, Chapter 1, Section 8 of the City of Park Ridge City Code, the Emergency Declaration issued on March 18, 2020, as it may be extended or amended from time-to-time, and the findings set forth above, I, Marty Maloney, the Mayor of the City of Park Ridge, in an effort to promote the most favorable operating conditions for the local restaurants which have suffered lost business opportunities during Phase 1 and Phase 2 of the Restore Illinois Plan, do hereby order the following:

### A. Short-Term Parking.

1. Section 13-16-8, Zones Designated, of the City Code is temporarily modified to suspend the enforcement of the metered parking zones on Prairie Avenue described below. The parking spaces in the zones described below will be temporarily designated as three (3) hour parking spaces and enforced in the same manner as the zones described in Section 13-15-6, Three Hour Zone, of the City Code.

2. Section 13-15-6, Three Hour Zone, of the City Code is temporarily modified to suspend the enforcement of the three hour zone on east side of Fairview Avenue described below, only north of the alley and south of Main Street. The parking spaces on the east side of Fairview Avenue and north of the alley in the zones described below will be temporarily designated as thirty (30) minute parking spaces and enforced in the same manner as the zones described in Section 13-15-2, Thirty Minute Zone, of the City Code.

3. Section 13-15-1, Fifteen-Minute Loading Zone, of the City Code is temporarily modified to designate a new fifteen-minute loading zone on south side of Main Street and west of Fairview Avenue, as described below. Section 13-15-6, Three Hour Zone, of the City Code is temporarily modified to suspend the enforcement of the three hour zone designation on Main Street for the two additional loading zone spaces herein described.

Main South Side Two parking spaces, fronting on the property line of 36 Main Street

4. Section 13-15-1, Fifteen-Minute Loading Zone, of the City Code is temporarily modified to increase the fifteen-minute loading zone on west side of South Fairview Avenue, as described below, from two spaces to three spaces. Section 13-15-6, Three Hour Zone, of the City Code is temporarily modified to suspend the enforcement of the three hour zone designation on South Fairview Avenue for the additional loading zone space herein described.

5. Section 13-15-6, Three Hour Zone, of the City Code is temporarily modified to suspend the enforcement of the three hour zone on west side of Prospect Avenue described below, only for one parking space south of the alley fronting on the property line of 122 S. Prospect. Section 13-15-1, Fifteen-Minute Loading Zone, of the City Code is temporarily modified to enforce one parking space south of the alley fronting on the property line of 122 S. Prospect as a fifteen-minute loading zone.

- 6. None of the temporary parking enforcement rules described herein will be for the benefit of a particular business. All temporary parking enforcement rules described herein are generally available for the patrons of any business.
- B. <u>Temporary Parking Signs</u>. The Department of Public Works is directed to produce or procure and erect temporary signs to accurately advertise the designation of the parking zones and spaces herein described for the term of this Order. Businesses may neither erect any sign or device related to the designation of any parking zone or parking space nor reserve any parking zone or parking space for any particular business.
- C. <u>Enforcement</u>. The City of Park Ridge Police Department and Public Works Department are authorized to implement, administer and enforce the City Code consistent with this Executive Order pursuant to Section 3-1-8(G) of the City of Park Ridge City Code.

This Executive Order does not supersede or relieve any person from complying with the requirements set forth in the Governor's Executive Orders. This Executive Order is not intended to be interpreted or applied in a manner that is less restrictive than the Governor's Executive Orders.

This Executive Order will be effective as of June 4, 2020, at 12:00 p.m. and will expire at the conclusion of the Emergency Declaration, as amended or extended. The Executive Order will filed with the City Clerk as soon as practicable.
